The Recommendation emphasizes the pivotal role of global citizenship education in achieving sustainable peace and advancing human development. In response, we aim to critically examine and reimagine our educational practices as tools for fostering peace and shared prosperity. In line with this, UNITAR Jeju International Training Center (UNITAR CIFAL Jeju) has been committed to strengthening capacities for sustainable development in the Asia-Pacific region. The Center is actively engaging in advocacy activities for GCED dissemination while implementing the Visiting Global Citizenship Education Program targeting local communities in Seogwipo City, Jeju Island.

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Learning Objectives of Visiting Global Citizenship Education for Elementary, middle, and high school students and Youth & GCED-Focused Schools By the end of GCED session, participants will be able to: • Develop the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to become active global citizens, capable of engaging in diverse activities related to international development cooperation, including meaningful participation in the international community and potential careers in Official Development Assistance (ODA). • Enhance understanding of key concepts in international development—such as interconnectivity, social justice, human rights, sustainable development, and diversity—and recognize their significance in addressing global challenges. • Analyze global issues from economic, social, political, and environmental perspectives, and cultivate critical thinking and balanced viewpoints to effectively promote the global common good as responsible global citizens.

Visiting Global Citizenship Education for Elementary, middle, and high school students and Youth & GCED-Focused Schools: -Structure: Deployment of professional GCED educators to deliver in-person education to elementary, middle, and high school students in Seogwipo City, as well as to youth and lead teachers across Jeju Province - Content: Students are required to take one mandatory course - Global Citizenship (Interconnectivity) and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and one optional course on Human Rights and Child Rights, Poverty and Inequality, International Development and Careers,
